

A Christmas Story, The Musical

is based on the 1983 Warner Brother's movie classic. A Christmas Story, which itself was based on stories by legendary radio humorist Jean Shepherd and his book. In God We Trust, All Others Pay Cash, with songs both funny and sentimental by Benj Pasek and Justin Paul. and a faithful, yet inventive, book by Joseph Robinette.

The musical paints a refreshing holiday portrait of simpler time in America - unforgettably capturing every child's holiday wonder with deliciously wicked wit, a nostalgic eye, and a heart of gold.

It's really Jean Shepherd's story!

A CHRISTMAS STORY, THE MUSICAL began life in the mind of author, radio host, raconteur, and comic genius Jean Shepherd. Based on his childhood in 1930s Indiana, Shepherd spun a series of tales that he either published as short stories, read for his radio audience, or presented live on the college circuit. Among these tales were *Duel in the Snow or Red Ryder Nails the Cleveland Street Kid*, *Flick's Tongue*, and *My Old Man and The Lascivious Special Award That Heralded The Birth of Pop Art*.



These stories and others were woven together by Shepherd, screenwriter Leigh Brown, and director Bob Clark into a screenplay for the 1983 film, *A Christmas Story*. Shepherd's voice is heard as the narrator in the film and he even makes a cameo appearance in the film as one of the disgruntled customers waiting in line for Santa Clause.

In the seventies, Shepherd took his talents to television in a series of humorous narratives for PBS called *Jean Shepherd's America*, later continued on the PBS New Jersey Network as Shepherd's Pie. Here he was able to show us the more offbeat aspects of America, particularly his own home state, which he loved to ridicule. This led to a series of teleplays for PBS/WGBH's American Playhouse: The Phantom of the Open Hearth, The Great American Fourth of July and Other Disasters, Ollie Hopnoodle's Haven of Bliss, and The Star-Crossed Romance of Josephine Cosnowski. Shepherd passed away on October 16, 1999 at the age of 78.

The Story Becomes a Movie

In the late 1960s, *A Christmas Story* director Bob Clark was driving to a date's house when he heard a broadcast of radio personality and writer Jean Shepherd's recollections of growing up in Indiana in the late '30s and early '40s. Clark wound up driving around the block for almost an hour, glued to the radio until the program was over. "My date was not happy," Clark said, but he knew right away he wanted to make a movie out of the stories.

To find an American city resembling the fictional Hohman, Indiana of the 1940s, director Clark sent his location scouts to twenty cities before selecting Cleveland, Ohio, as the site for filming. The decision to film in Cleveland was due to the willingness of Higbee's (an actual department store) to allow the movie to be filmed inside the store. The house from the movie is located just outside of downtown Cleveland and the Higbee building still stands in downtown Cleveland.



The modestly budgeted movie opened in 1983 the week before Thanksgiving on fewer than 900 screens. It was a good showing, but not great. At the same time, home video and cable television were just beginning to grow in popularity, and A Christmas Story crept into the mainstream through videotape and cable broadcasts. The cable network TNT first aired its 12 show. 24-hour marathon as a stunt in 1988, but popular demand turned stunt into tradition. The annual marathon (now aired on TBS) starts every Christmas Eve and attracts more than 40 million people who tune in at some point to watch. A Christmas Story is now one of the most popular holiday movies of all time, earning a place along side It's A Wonderful Life and Miracle on 34th Street.

Highee's Department Store

Higbee's was the first department store in the greater Cleveland area. The 12-floor Higbee Company building was the anchor for Cleveland's Public Square from its opening in 1931 until its eventual closure on Monday, Jan. 7, 2002.

Higbee's is named for Edwin Converse Higbee. Edwin Higbee opened the Hower & Higbee Dry Goods store in 1860 with partner John G. Hower. After Hower's passing, Edwin Higbee became President and the name of the store was changed to the Higbee Company.

Edwin Higbee served as President from 1897 until his death in January 1906. The company lived on and opened its department store in 1931. In the decade of the 1960s, Higbee's established six stores in the Cleveland suburbs. The profitable chain was sold in 1987 to Dillard Dept. Stores and Edward J. DeBartolo. At that time Higbee's was the area's largest sales volume retailer of high-end fashion merchandise, with 14 stores in northeast Ohio. When DeBartolo sold his share in July 1992, the chain was renamed Dillard's.



When the Higbee's closed on Monday, Jan. 7, 2002, it was the last of the downtown department stores in Cleveland.

Benj Pasek & Justin Paul are two friends who ended up writing the music and lyrics for the stage version of *A Christmas Story*.

Pasek and Paul first teamed up in college after not getting cast in the shows they wanted to be in. They decided to start writing their own material. An album of loosely related songs were written in 2005 called *Edges*. Together, Pasek and Paul have also written the music and lyrics to the 2010 musical *James and the Giant Peach*, *Dogfight*, and the popular Broadway musical, *Dear Evan Hansen*.

Audiences will also recognize their work in films such as La La Land, The Greatest Showman, the Live action Aladdin, and Dear Evan Hansen.

Meet the Music Men



Although Pasek and Paul were not the first music writers for the project, they were brought on in 2009 to write a completely new score for the show. *A Christmas Story* was their Broadway debut as songwriters. It opened on Broadway in 2012, and the two songwriters were nominated for a 2013 Tony for Best Original Score.

The Movies One of the most popular forms of entertainment was at the local movie house where the family might have seen National Velvet, Lassie Come Home, Flash Gordon, Roy Rogers, and Superman. Ralphie could go to see a double feature like an old time western with newsreels and a cartoon-plus buy a candy bar-for only a dime!

The World of the Story

The year is 1940. This was just as the Great Depression was coming to an end and just before the United States entered World War II.

The world of Ralphie Parker in *A Christmas Story* is very different from life today. Televisions were very rare. Instead, radios and newspapers provided an information lifeline for Americans. Whole families gathered around the radio to listen to news broadcasts and popular programs like *Little Orphan Annie*, quiz shows, mysteries, dramas, music, and sports.

Here are just a few toys and popular items of the day in Ralphie's world...

Zeppelin Randy receives a toy
Zeppelin or airship for
Christmas. A Zeppelin was
pioneered by the German
Count Ferdinand von Zeppelin
in the early 20th century. Given
the outstanding success of the
Zeppelin design, the term
"Zeppelin" in casual use came
to refer to all rigid airships.



Decoder Rings were all the rage during the golden age of radio, lending an air of participation to popular radio shows like the *Little Orphan Annie Show*.



Ovaltine is a brand of milk flavoring created in 1904 in Switzerland and is still available today. The powdery mix, made of sugar, malt extract, cocoa and whey, is often mixed with warm or hot milk. As a sponsor for *The Little Orphan Annie Show*, Ovaltine offered Secret Decoder Rings in exchange for proofs of purchase.

The World of the Story

The Little Orphan Annie Show was one of the first 15-minute daily radio serials made for children. The show was sponsored by Ovaltine and ran from 1930 to the early 1940s. It was inspired by the daily American comic strip by Harold Gray about a young orphan girl, her dog Sandy, and her guardian, Daddy Warbucks. They encounter many adventures including gangsters, spies, and kidnappers.



Lionel Trains were electric toy trains and model railroads that were embellished with hand-painted details and authentic elements. Elaborate train displays were often featured as part of department



store Christmas displays and a Lionel Train Set was routinely found under the tree on Christmas morning.


Will Your Tongue Really Stick to a Frozen Flagpole?

Apparently there are no shortage of kids willing to triple-dog dare their friends to try what they see in the movies. Take it from us, though, this is something that CAN happen and WILL happen, so don't try it yourselves!

Why it happens is just a matter of science. Since it sits inside your warm mouth all the time, your tongue is naturally coated with moisture. That moisture will quickly freeze if the temperature drops below 32°F.

So why doesn't your tongue freeze when you eat something cold, like ice cream? Your body keeps the tongue from freezing by pumping warm blood to your tongue. When you eat ice cream, for example, your body continually warms the tongue from the inside out.

Why doesn't this work if you lick a flagpole then? The reason your tongue sticks to a flagpole is the thermal conductivity of metal. Metals conduct heat extremely well. In fact, metal conducts heat about 400 times better than your tongue.




When your tongue freezes to a metal flagpole, the metal robs your tongue of heat much faster than it can be replaced

by your body. When you add in the fact that your tongue has all sorts of grooves and crevices where moisture hides, it's easy to see why it can freeze so quickly and get stuck so solidly to a metal flagpole — or any other type of very cold metal.

If you ever get your tongue — or any exposed skin — frozen solid to a flagpole or any other type of metal, just relax and don't panic. Don't try to pull it off right away, as you'll leave a nice coating of skin on the metal...and that won't feel very good at all!

Instead, just get help from someone as quickly as possible. Pouring warm water on and around your skin and the metal should heat things up, so that you can thaw your skin enough to separate it from the metal without permanent injury.


